- The students' evaluations times will be posted within four weeks after the registration. Any changes in the scheduling must be cleared through the AIM Chairman two weeks before the evaluation..
- A student missing their time will forfeit their opportunity to be evaluated and no refund of their registration fee will be provided.
- Teachers and parents are not allowed to enter the testing area.
- If students need to reschedule for any other reason, they must notify their teacher, who, in turn, will notify the Chapter AIM Chairman of the request. The request must be received three weeks prior to the testing date. If approved by the AIM committee, the teacher may arrange for that student to be judged on another date. That date must be within one week prior to or after the original testing date. The student is also required to pay a judging fee to the adjudicator per cluster. The teacher must make the arrangements and then notify the AIM Chairman.
- Judging fees are based on level. Levels 1 - 5 \$6.00 per student; Levels 6 - 9 \$8.00 per student and Level 10 \$10.00 per student.
- Teachers and students must abide by the code of ethics sustained by the National MTNA, the State UMTA and the Tooele Valley Chapter. The code of ethics is printed in the directories of each division of the Music Teachers Association.

UMTA Code of Ethics Addendum adopted September 2005

Responsibilities of Students and Their Parents in all UMTA/MTNA Programs and Competitions:

Students and their parents should maintain the highest standards of civility, moral conduct, and personal integrity when participating in UMTA/MTNA functions.

- They should respect and sustain the decision of judges, chairmen, and the State Executive Board of UMTA.
- Students and their parents who do not abide by this Code will forfeit the student's future participation in UMTA/MTNA competitions and programs.
